<p>Blog (short for web log): A weblog is a journal (or newsletter) that is frequently updated and intended for general public consumption. Blogs generally represent the personality of <u>one author</u>, use a dated log format (usually the most recent at the top) and may contain links to other web sites along with commentary. File-Sharing Programs: Programs that allow many different users to access the same file at the same time. These programs are usually used to illegally download music and software. Firewall: This is a system that creates a special "wall" used by network servers to separate their Intranet from the internet. It keeps out unwanted information like spam and viruses and unwanted people like hackers. Flaming: Sending a deliberately confrontational message to others on the internet. Instant Messaging (IM): A service that allows people to send and get messages almost instantly. To send messages using IM you need to download an IM program and know the IM address of another person who uses the same IM program. Internet Service Provider (ISP): A company that provides internet access to customers. Mouse Trapping: A commonly used technique by pornography sites where a user gets "locked" in a web site. While surfing the internet it is possible to click a web site and have multiple undesirable web sites open. When this happens, you often cannot close or back out of the sites and must close your web browser completely. MP3: A digital music file. MP3s allow you to play music on your computer. Pharming/Typo Squatting: Users type in what they think is a valid web-site address and are unknowingly redirected to an illegitimate site that steals their personal information. Phishing: An online scam that uses e-mail to "fish" for users' private information by imitating legitimate companies. People are lured into sharing user names, passwords, account information or credit-card numbers. The phishing e-mail usually contains a link to an illegitimate site. Scammers copy the look of a web site to set up a nearly identical page, one that appears to be part of that company's site. Piracy: Illegally copying copyrighted software, music, or movies. Spimming: Mass mailings sent as Instant Messages to users. Often these can feature links to explicit porn sites. Streaming (Media): The exchange of video clips, sound, or other types of media over the internet. It is a way for the user to quickly download these files. Warez: Pirated or illegally distributed software.
